Goal: August 17, 2007, Ulan Bator
Length: 7,108 km (4,417 miles)

The road from Europe to Asia is bumpy—and not only proverbially. Covering 4,549 kilometers (2,827 miles) of Russian and 2,559 kilometers (1,590 miles) of Mongolian "roadway," the Transsyberia participants had to overcome every conceivable kind of landscape: marshland, taiga, mountains, desert. It was a supreme challenge to human and machine. "The key to success in this tremendously tough marathon were experi-

ence and circumspection. It's unbelievable to come through such a rally in a luxury vehicle," said winner Rod Millen, from the USA, at the end of the ordeal for the 33 teams from a total of 15 countries. For nine days, the German duo of former European rally champion Armin Schwarz and Oliver Hilger had held on to the lead. The Transsyberia Rally 2007 was certainly one of the great adventures on four wheels.
